Errata and Revisions

Page 61, lines 12 and 13: “lived alone, until a divorce was eventually granted.” should be “lived alone.”

Page 93, caption line 9: “slander-for-hire” should be “libeler-for-hire”

Page 118: Mention should have been made here that Bierce returned to the Wasp’s pages in January 1891, contributing two columns “Unauthenticated Tales” and “Social Chatter,” one of which appeared nearly every week until February 1892.

Page 204, caption line 1: should be “Plate 41:”

Page 248, caption line 1: strike “[sic]”.

Page 256: Mention should have been made that the image was based on Emmanuel Fremiet’s sculpture of the previous year, “Gorilla Carrying off a Woman.”

Page 262: caption lines 11 and 12 should read: “The title was a 19th century catch-phrase supposedly uttered by 18th century Native American Iroquois leader John Logan. The answer he himself gave to the question was, “No one.”
